

MEMORIAL RESOLUTION

THOMAS TINGEY CRAVEN GREGORY (d. 1933)

Thomas Tingey Craven Gregory, graduate of Stanford University in 1899, member of the Board of Trustees since 1919, and for the past decade and more a resident of the campus, came to an untimely death in an automobile accident on the fourth day of this month, June, 1933.

Entering the practice of law after graduation Mr. Gregory served as District Attorney of Solano County., the county in which he was born, and later moved to San Francisco, where he became one of the leading members of the bar in that city. During his career he acted as counsel for, or director in, many business corporations.

Upon the entry of this country into the World War, he went overseas as captain in the 144th Field Artillery with the American Expeditionary Forces. Later he was called upon to become one of the original members of the American Relief Administration in Europe. He was made the director of the American Relief Administration for Central Europe, assistant to the Director of Relief for the Supreme Economic Council, and American member of the Interallied Commission in the Austro-Hungarian and Jugo-Slavian empires. In the execution of his duties at this period he exhibited astute and forceful decision that averted political and economic disaster. Mr. Gregory possessed outstanding ability as organizer administrator and executive and his capacities were placed generously at the disposal of his associates, as an undergraduate in student affairs, as an alumnus in aiding alumni effort for the University., as a Trustee in safeguarding the University's manifold interests, and as a citizen in cooperating with others for general welfare. His fellow-members on the University Board of Trustees demonstrated their high regard for his talents and eagerness to serve Stanford by electing him to responsible offices on the Board and its committees.

Be it resolved that the Academic Council declare its recognition of the great loss suffered by Stanford University by reason of the death of Mr. Gregory.

And be it further resolved that this statement be spread upon the minutes of this Council, and that a copy of this resolution be forwarded to Mrs. Gregory and the members of the family, with an expression of the sympathy of this Council.
